Finn Laursen, Jean Monnet Chair, Dalhousie University: *EU-Canada Relations: Case of Mutual neglect?*

Biography

Finn Laursen received his PhD from the University of Pennsylvania in 1980. He now holds a Canada Research Chair (Tier 1) of EU Studies at Dalhousie University, Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada. Recently he has also received an *ad personam* Jean Monnet Chair and he directs the EU Centre of Excellence at Dalhousie University. Earlier positions include: Professor of International Politics, University of Southern Denmark 1999-2006 (where he directed the Centre for European Studies and held a Jean Monnet Chair); London School of Economics (1985-88), European Institute of Public Administration, Maastricht (1988-95); shorter periods at Tsukuba University, Japan, and at Fudan University, China. Edited books include: *Political Economy of European Integration* (Kluwer, 1995), *The Amsterdam Treaty* (Odense University Press, 2002), *Comparative Regional Integration* (Ashgate, 2003), *The Treaty of Nice* (Nijhoff, 2006) and *The Rise and Fall of the EU's Constitutional Treaty* (Nijhoff, 2008).
